Community Living Chatham-Kent recently underwent the accreditation process with FOCUS Accreditation.

Two FOCUS Accreditation validators were onsite November 22nd – 25th, and another two validators participated virtually. During that week, FOCUS completed twenty (20) interviews (in-person and virtually), reviewed twenty-six (26) files (Board Members, people accessing services, and employees), and visited several sites. While visiting sites, they were able to speak with people accessing services. Prior to the onsite validation, two hundred and ninety-two (292) surveys were sent to various stakeholders including Board Members, people accessing services, employees, families, students, community partners, and funders. There were two hundred and thirty-four (234) survey responses.

Sandy Morrow and I were informed on January 11th, that CLC-K had achieved, with a score of 94.5 %, a four year accreditation for the period of January 2022 – January 2026. CLC-K is the first organization to be accredited using the newly revised 2020 FOCUS Standards.

I extend a thank you to every employee as each of you has made a tremendously valuable contribution to CLC-K.





Community Living Chatham-Kent (CLC-K) is pleased to announce the recipients of the Jonathan Daniel Stone Fund. Awards were presented virtually on January 27, 2022.

Graceon C. is four years old and participates in the Children's Respite Program at CLC-K. Graceon received an iPad and educational tools to assist him with communication.

Ten-year-old Aiden D. received an iPad, noise-canceling headphones, and a keyboard to increase his communication skills and promote engagement with peers. Aiden's world will expand with the opportunity to explore educational resources and increase his confidence while communicating with others.

Jack B. is an energetic seven-year-old who participates in the Children's Respite Program at CLC-K. Jack's father received the funding to participate in parent education services through the Learning and Behaviour Clinic and Pyramid Educational Consultants.

In May of 2013, Daniel passed at the age of 11. The fund created by Jonathan Daniel Stone's family celebrates his life. The fund annually supports initiatives to assist children who have been diagnosed with autism and/or other diverse abilities and their families. A review committee comprised of Dr. Jonathan and Sarah Stone, a person supported by Community Living Chatham-Kent, two Community Living Chatham-Kent Managers, and a Community Living Chatham-Kent Board Member, selected recipients.



The Rob McLandress Make a Dream Come True Fund was made possible through a bequest to Community Living Chatham-Kent by the late Father James Williams. Father Williams was an ongoing supporter of the work of Community Living Chatham-Kent and his bequest was made in honour of Rob McLandress, whose family he was very close to.

The Fund will accept applications from persons who have diverse abilities to assist them to make a dream a reality for them. The applications will be reviewed by a committee and two awards of \$1,000 each will be granted annually.

Applications will be available February 21 - April 15, 2022.

Recipients are advised of their status during Community Living Month Flag Raising being held May 3, 2022, at the Civic Centre.


