During a special ceremony dedicated to honouring Ukraine, Mother Nature also put on her best show to help pay tribute to the country's citizens in Chatham-Kent.

The colours of the nation's flag were on full display in a sense. In the bluest of skies, the sun shone down on beds of sunflowers, with monarch butterflies, as if on cue, arriving at the Salute to Ukraine Rotary Park.

The Rotary Sunrise Club of Chatham hosted the grand opening for the park, located at the corner of Grand Avenue East and Victoria Avenue.

A short program featured guest speakers, along with the raising of the Canadian and Ukrainian flags, followed by refreshments and conversation. "I am so grateful to Chatham-Kent," Nina Zeleney, who came to Canada when she was seven years old, told The Daily News. "I couldn't be more proud."

The sunflower is the national flower of Ukraine, and has become a symbol this year against Russia's invasion of the country.

Orest Tiahur has lived in Chatham for 30 years, and now resides near the park. He was impressed by the tribute and show of solidarity from the Chatham-Kent community. "Thank you Canada for supporting Ukraine," he said, adding he tries to talk to family members, most living in the western part of the country, at least once a week.

Through an interpreter, Olga Turovska, who arrived in Canada in May, said she was also touched. "(I'm) very thankful that they did this for Ukraine," she said. She called the ceremony especially emotional, given that her 45-year-old son is currently serving in the Ukrainian military protecting their homeland. "Every day I think about him and miss him," she said.

The tribute park is a co-operative effort by Rotary Sunrise and property owner Community Living Chatham-Kent.

On February 24, 2022, Russia launched a full-scale attack on Ukraine. According to NGOs European Disability Forum, and Inclusion Europe, it is estimated that there are at least 2.7 million people who access services in Ukraine. This vulnerable group of citizens are being neglected, and desperately require medicine, food, and water to survive.

"We are saddened by the ongoing crisis in Ukraine. We extend our thoughts and prayers to everyone impacted by this war, and hope to provide urgent care to those in need," said Nicole Roeszler, Manager of Community Relations with Community Living Chatham-Kent.

Ed Dickson, Overseas Director for Loads of Love Humanitarian Aid and Mission, has been instrumental in assisting with directing the funds to Ukraine. "This donation will be used in the city of Kryvyi Rih, Ukraine, to help fifty families and people who have diverse abilities. The funds will help with desperately needed groceries and medicine." Ed added, "We are beyond grateful to Community Living Chatham-Kent for their generous support."

It was a beautiful day!




















All participants enjoyed putting out a virtual fire using a real fire extinguisher.
