advancement of skills, and of course, quality time spent with his mother.

Thomas will be able to utilize this tablet device and the corresponding headphones to promote positive emotional regulation/stimulation. He will utilize the multiple applications and device features to gain skills of independence, time management, finances, and other knowledge that contributes to independent living. His mother is especially looking forward to using the device for positive interactions and quality time together (i.e., looking up recipes to make).

The second recipient was Sebastian Campbell. Sebastian is fourteen years old, and enrolled in high school in September. Through support from Occupational Therapy, it was recommended for him to utilize a durable laptop for educational purposes. From reducing stress and anxiety, to being able to complete assignments quicker and easier, Sebastian will benefit tremendously from the laptop and computer programming. The funding will allow for a happier working environment for Sebastian, which will hopefully lead to a more enjoyable high school experience.

This fund created by Jonathan Daniel Stone's family, celebrates his life. Daniel was a child who had autism and died suddenly at the age of 11 in May of 2013. The purpose of the fund is to annually support initiatives to assist children who have been diagnosed with autism and/or other diverse abilities. Daniel's fund can be utilized for but is not limited to recreational activities, educational workshops for parents and siblings, advocacy, vocation and life skills development, assistive devices and equipment that promote and facilitate learning or communication.
