



Through our partnerships with local organizations, we strive to make a positive impact and support the values of acceptance and inclusivity within our community.











Community Living Chatham-Kent attains the highest standard to meet accessibility achievements to accommodate people who access services, employees and visitors.


In September, a washroom at one of our locations was upgraded to include a fully accessible shower, vanity, and door. This update will allow people to use this washroom free of barriers.
